I wrote you some time ago respecting the freeboard of Hawthorn Leslie's No 529 and 30 and as I do not appear to have got a reply, I shall be glad if you will do so as it interests me.

You will doubtless have heard that I had a little operation carried out, anyhow the Specialist was very satisfied and as I have to visit him in about 10 days, he hopes to be able to confirm the statement made on the certificate to the Committee viz:- complete recovery in a few months time. He thinks I may have strained the vocal chord (after my description of the work carried out by me, more or less daily) when in enclosed spaces such as D. B. tanks & when pneumatic riveting & caulking were going on and described this on the certificate as "over use of the voice". Trusting you are still keeping quite well and with kindest regards,
