Particulars of Casualty

This trawler stranded at Portaleen,  
Culdaff Bay, near Malin Head, on the  
22nd February, 1949.

She was towed off about six hours  
later and sank about three hours after that  
in fifteen fathoms of water approximately three  
miles from shore.

No reply has been received to the  
casualty notice addressed to the Owners on the  
14th instant.

## SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

**WILLIAM MANNELL.** — Malin Head  
Radio, Feb. 22. — Following received  
from British trawler Gava:  
At 5.45 a.m.: Trawler William  
Mannell is ashore at Portaleen; we are  
standing by her.  
At 6.10 a.m.: Want no assistance,  
will try and pull William Mannell off  
at daylight. She is not leaking.

Port-  
patrick Radio, Feb. 22. — Following  
received from British trawler Gava at  
11.34 a.m.: Ship ashore, all crew safe.  
This refers to trawler William Man-  
nell ashore at Portaleen, Culdaff Bay,  
Inishtrahull. Crew now on board  
trawler Gava.

London, Feb.  
22. — Trawler William Mannell had not  
been refloated at 3.30 p.m. The vessel  
has a cargo of fish on board. An official  
of the owners stated to-day that if the  
weather improved a marine surveyor  
would fly to the scene of the stranding.

**WILLIAM MANNELL.** — Londonderry,  
Feb. 24. — Trawler William Mannell:  
Surveyor from Fleetwood Trawlers  
Mutual Insurance Association proceeded  
to Culdaff Bay on Tuesday afternoon  
(Feb. 22). He did not request our  
assistance. New understand vessel  
was towed off by trawler Gava on Tues-  
day forenoon and sank about three miles  
from shore in about 15 fathoms. —  
Lloyd's Agents. (See issue of Feb. 23.)

**WILLIAM MANNELL.** — London, Feb. 25.  
— Information received from Fleetwood  
states that trawler William Mannell was  
towed off at 12.15 p.m. on Feb. 22 and  
part crew reboarded her. She sank at  
3 p.m. the same day, three miles east  
of Dunmore Head, Culdaff Bay, in 14-15  
fathoms. (See issue of Feb. 25.)
