## SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

**MUDO.**—North Foreland Radio, May 4.—Following received from British steamer ALGOL (Byth for London) at 6 p.m., G.M. 13: "In collision with Dutch motor vessel Mudo (London for Middlesbrough) in lat. 52° 15' N., long. 1° 51' 45" E. Picked up four survivors, two unharmed for. The Mudo sank. Lifeboat lowered in attempt to find the two missing but returned without them. ALGOL is badly holed, 17 ft. of water in forepeak; proceeding at slow speed to London. ALGOL is not in need of immediate assistance.

Lowestoft, May 4.—Lowestoft lifeboat launched and proceeding to search for missing members of crew of Dutch motor vessel Mudo, reported sunk through collision with steamer ALGOL. (Later) Lifeboat has returned after fruitless search for missing members of crew of motor vessel Mudo.

London, May 4.—Lowestoft lifeboat was to-night searching for two men missing from the Dutch motor vessel Mudo, 218 tons gross, which sank after collision in thick fog near Lowestoft with the British steamer ALGOL, 1578 tons gross, owned by Monroe Bros., Ltd., of Liverpool. The remaining four members of the crew of the Mudo were saved. The collision occurred at 6 p.m., when visibility had been reduced by thick fog to less than 25 yards. Immediately after the collision the ALGOL launched a lifeboat to search for the missing men, but found nothing. Lowestoft lifeboat has taken up the search. The ALGOL has a big hole forward and 17 ft. of water in the forepeak; proceeded slowly to London under her own power.

London, May 5.—Four survivors, the ship's engineer, one able seaman and two ordinary seamen, of motor vessel Mudo, which collided with steamer ALGOL, arrived here on board the ALGOL at 8.30 a.m. to-day.
