Dear Sir,

M. I am in receipt of your letter of yesterday's date regarding a trawler, 216 ft. in length, proposed to be built by Messrs. Hall, Russell & Co., Ltd., and in reply have to inform you that the plans of this vessel may be dealt with in your Office. For the information and guidance of the Surveyors I enclose eight approved hull plans of a similar vessel, the steam trawler "VIKINGS", together with the scantling sheet for this vessel, and I shall be glad if you will be good enough to return them after noting.

It will be observed from the sheet that the scantlings were obtained partly by interpolation and by comparison with those approved in previous similar cases.

I think it well to point out that revised extended Rules for Trawlers were approved by the Committee in November last, and a copy of these is also enclosed. These revised Rules, however, are not yet in compulsory operation, but may be adopted by the Builders or the Owners, but if it is ^{so} desired by the Builders, the scantlings of the proposed vessel may be dealt with on the basis set forth in the preceding paragraph of this letter.
