Dear Sir,

Reverting to our letter of the 17th ultimo and to your reply of the 23rd ultimo regarding the Hillen's valves to be fitted in Messrs. Cockerill's yard No. 675 we beg to inform you that the Builders have a letter from Mr. Hillen stating that the firm Messrs. Acieries Anversoises of Antwerp have completed the order for these valves except twenty covers for same. The valves are at present in Holland and Mr. Hillen wishes Cockerills to accept the valves and for tests to be carried out at Hoboken, the matter being of great urgency the Builders are anxious to have matters expedited as much as possible.

They suggest that the valves be drop, hammer and water tested by us at their yard.

In our opinion provided these tests are satisfactory the valves in this instance may be accepted.

The builders will greatly appreciate an early reply.
