Dear Sirs,

I duly received your memorandum of the 14th instant respecting the steamer "DIANA", from which it is noted that this vessel is still laid up and that you have been given to understand that she might probably be leaving your port soon, in which case the local agents will advise you accordingly.

I may say that the Committee have had this case before them at their meeting today with reference to the outstanding surveys and while they are prepared to defer action while the vessel is definitely laid up they would require the usual General Examination to be made should it be proposed to send the vessel to sea before carrying out the 5th Special Survey No.1 and Boiler Survey.

I shall be glad if you will inform the local agents accordingly and I have to add that you should keep the case under your notice and advise me promptly should the vessel proceed to sea before being submitted to survey as required.
