A. I am in receipt of your letter of the 21st instant, respecting the account for the fees on H.M. Tug. "DAINTY", and note your remarks in regard thereto. As has already been intimated the accounts for fees due in this case have been rendered from this office, and in this connexion I have to inform you that in all cases where fees are payable by the Admiralty direct, accounts are sent from this office, and this applies to the Admiralty Tugs of the "STOIC", "RESCUE", "SIR DAVID HUNTER" and "RACIA" types, and also to "B.D." vessels.

The cases of auxiliary vessels to Admiralty order in which accounts are rendered by the Society's local offices to Builders, are Admiralty Trawlers and Drifters, and also Standard vessels.
