I beg to acquaint you that a Representative of Messrs. David Alexander & Sons, the Managing Owners for the Ministry of Shipping of the Danish Steamer "MICHAEL JEBSEN", No. 29693 in the Register Book, has called at this Office and stated that the vessel is lying at Hong Kong and that it is desired that she be transferred to British Registry and that her Danish Loadline Certificates be replaced by British Certificates.

It is also desired that a general examination be carried out as detailed in your letter of the 30th ultimo for the special record of "Examined L.R. (with date)" in the Register Book.

They further ask that instructions may be cabled to the Society's Surveyors at Hong Kong accordingly.
