*Surveyed the S.S. "UGO BASSI" of Fiume, 2900 tons gross, whilst lying afloat at Antwerp on the 14th of April 1940 for Damage stated to have been sustained through loss of the starboard bower anchor and its 9 lengths of chain cable at Buniana (Spain) on the 29th of February 1940 whilst on a voyage from Naples to Buniana, and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have **Recommended** that she be continued as classed in the Society's Register Book without fresh record of survey subject to one Bower anchor being placed on board at an early opportunity,*

being fit to carry dry and perishable Cargoes.
