Surveyed the Steel Screw Tanker "SALUTA", 6261 tons gross register of London, afloat at Hawke's Harbour, Labrador, on the 12th August, 1951, and subsequent dates for damage stated sustained through grounding at the entrance of Hawke's Harbour, Labrador, on the 14th July, 1951, while being towed to that port by Ocean Tug "FOUNDATION JOSEPHINE", enroute from Bermuda, B.W.I. in a loaded condition,

and that I ^{we will} have transmitted ^{XX XXXX} to the Committee of Lloyd's ^{temporary} Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me ^{us} have been completed to my ^{our} satisfaction, and
