the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Owners' Representative, attend on board the Steel Twin Screw Steamer "VALENA", 913 Tons Gross, of Panama, whilst she lay afloat in Marseilles Harbour on the 16th August, 1951, for the purpose of ascertaining if the vessel was in efficient condition to be towed in ballast condition to Genoa (Italy) for breaking up purposes.

The following parts were generally examined and found, so far as seen, in efficient condition:- the holds, tween decks, accommodation spaces in forecastle midships and poop, machinery spaces, decks, casings, ventilators, hatchways and closing appliances, general equipment.


