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 This vessel was built under the survey of the British Corporation to plans mutually approved by this Society and the British Corporation for the "Castle" class trawlers.

A first entry report has now been received from the London Surveyors giving particulars of scantlings, equipment etc., and these appear generally to be in accordance with the approved plans.

The Surveyors also report that the vessel has been examined in dry dock, and the requirements of a special survey No.3 carried out, and minor repairs effected.

The workmanship appears to be good.
