The remarks of the Chief Ship Surveyor are desired on this case for the consideration of the Classing Committee.

The class of this vessel was expunged from the Register Book 10.48 and a notation of "Damaged by explosion and fire 7.48" inserted.

The RIO DE JANEIRO Surveyor reports (9.48) the vessel generally examined afloat on account of explosion and fire as above and damage found to bulkheads, decks, etc.

The Surveyor recommends that the vessel be submitted to a complete examination before she again goes into commission.

It is stated that it is understood from the local Lloyd's Agents that the Underwriters have now taken over the vessel with instructions to sell her locally if possible.
