Dear Sirs.

We thank you for your letters of the 17 th and 20th march. There are no news from "Edna" or from her crew after the last message recieved by Aalesund Radio in the afternoon the 7 march when she was reported sinking and that the crew had to go into the lifeboats. We suppose ~~xxxx~~ that the sea and wether was so bad that it was impossible to get out the lifeboats and that the crew followed the ship when she was lost.

The captain's name was Carl Folke Carlstedt, number of crew incl. captain 18 man. The ship was loaded with a cargo of pulp from Oplö in Namsos district Norge to Preston. She left Oplö at 1700 o'clock on the 4th of march.

The case will appeare before the court in Mariehamn on the 7th of april, and the ship will be expunged from the register in Mariehamn.

The position, of the accident, you mention in your letter is the same as we have, but although a big search was made from airplanes and ships, nothing has been seen or found so far.

We thank you for your interest in this case.
