Sir,

In reply to the query contained in your classing letter of the 23rd instant, re the width of main and raised quarter deck stringer plates in the S.S. "CHR. GYLSTORFF", I beg to state that the main deck stringer was fitted 44" in width (as shewn on the approved plan) in the ship but a long coaling hatch was fitted cutting into the stringer plate, the width of the stringer plate in way of coaling hatch being 34" as given on my Report; the raised quarter deck stringer plate was fitted 39" in width as shewn on the approved plans.

I regret these points were not made clear on the plans.
