This ship sprang a leak in heavy weather and foundered 1200 miles east of Yokohama, on the 9th November.

No reply has been received to the Casualty notice addressed to the Owners on the 29th November.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION

KINUGASA MARU. — San Francisco, Nov. 9. — The Radio Marine Station at Point Reyes, California, picked up an S.O.S. from the Japanese steamer Kinugasa Maru at 2.15 p.m. G.M.T. today, saying she was in need of immediate help and that No. 3 hold was flooding in position lat. 41 50 N. long. 163 20 E. The Kinugasa Maru, with 42 men on board, is reported to be carrying iron ore. — Reuter.

KINUGASA MARU. — Yokohama, Nov. 10. — Steamer Kinugasa Maru yesterday reported 12 starboard frames in No. 3 hold leaking through four places in position lat. 41 50 N. long. 163 20 E. (See issue of Nov. 10.)

KINUGASA MARU. — Yokohama, Nov. 15. — Steamer Kinugasa Maru yesterday reported crew removed to motor vessel Kamikawa Maru, standing by, in view of position becoming dangerous on account of bad weather. position lat. 38 12 N. long. 164 20 E. (See issue of Nov. 12.)

KINUGASA MARU. — Honolulu, Nov. 16. — A storm is heading towards the Japanese steamer Kinugasa Maru, which, with a crew of 42 on board, is reported to be sinking 1250 miles NW. of Midway Island, in the Pacific. A United States naval troop transport is on her way to take off the crew and another Japanese vessel is standing by after failing to transfer the crew. — British United Press. (See issue of Nov. 16.)

KINUGASA MARU. — Tokyo, Nov. 18. — The crew of 42 today abandoned the leaking Japanese steamer Kinugasa Maru off Central Japan when the pumps stopped working. The vessel sprang a leak on Nov. 9 in a storm. The Kinugasa Maru, which was reported carrying iron ore, was still afloat and the crew were standing by to-night. — Reuter. (See issue of Nov. 12.)

KINUGASA MARU. — Tokyo, Nov. 19. — Japanese steamer Kinugasa Maru sank today 1200 miles east of Yokohama. All 42 members of the crew were rescued, the Japanese Maritime Safety Board reported. The patrol vessel Hato Maru and other ships steamed to the rescue when the Kinugasa Maru, which was carrying iron ore from Nahaime to Yokohama, signalled on Nov. 9 that she was leaking. — Reuter. (See issue of Nov. 19.)

KINUGASA MARU. — Yokohama, Nov. 20. — Steamer Kinugasa Maru, laden with 7540 tons of iron ore, reported sunk yesterday in lat. 32 9 N. long. 168 35 E. (See issue of Nov. 20.)


