In accordance with instructions contained in the London letter of May 30th proceeded to this vessel at Blydebank and examined the thrust blocks on the turbine shafts, found the white metal of pads slightly scored. A new set of pads have now been fitted, the machinery was tried on the measured inch when all worked satisfactorily. The safety valves of the main boilers having been reported leaking were overhauled ground up and re-adjusted to the above working pressure.

## General Observations, Opinion, and Recommendation:—
