Steel Twin Screw Steamer "CRACOVIA". Built at Trieste by the Cantiere San Roco.

Owners: Lloyd Triestino.

The Classing Committee had before them on Friday, 28th ultimo, the First Entry Reports on this vessel with a special submission as regards the date of build to be recorded in the Register Book.

The steamer was commenced in March, 1913 and launched on the 5th February, 1916 and completed on the 20th November, 1920.

The Surveyor states that the vessel was moored partly at the Builders' Yard and partly at the Arsenal of the Lloyd Triestino, the Owners of the ship, from the date she was launched until the trials were run.

In August, 1920 all the tanks were examined internally and the holds, tween decks, peaks, decks, bottom, rudder, etc. were examined during the months of September, October and November last, and were found in very good condition.

As the vessel appears to have been carefully attended to during the war, and has throughout been under the supervision of the Society's Surveyors, who have recently examined her, the Chief Ship Surveyors submit that the date of build might be recorded as November, 1920.

Somewhat similar cases of vessels built during the war in the Trieste district are as follow:-

S.S. "CLARA CAMUS". Commenced in September, 1913 and launched in November, 1914. The General Committee agreed to the date of the last examination in dry dock, namely, April, 1920, being recorded as the date of build.
