Sir,

I duly received your letter of the 29th ultimo, enclosing Newport Report, No. 20239, on the steamer "CLAN MACNAIR", and have to confirm the telegram which I sent you this morning, as follows:-

"CLAN MACNAIR", Newport Surveyors' recommendations not carried out here. (Stop) No advice received of cutting of escape holes in 'tween decks, and openings already covered with cargo when vessel arrived here. Work will be completed on return".

The escape holes referred to were cut at Newport without the knowledge of the Builders, and consequently no action was taken in regard to the same when the vessel returned here to complete loading. The work will be completed on the vessel's return from her present voyage.

The Newport Report is returned herewith.
