became due in May and June, 1923, respectively for First Special
Survey No.1 and in May and June last for First Special Survey No.2.

The barges have been laid up in the Tyne for some
years, and the usual undertaking was furnished by the late Owners.
They have now been sold through the Agency of Messrs.R.Thorman &
Sons, Ltd., of Newcastle, for use as hulks, and on their arrival
at Piraeus they will become the property of the Coal Trading
Association, of Rotterdam.

In a letter, dated 30th ultimo, Messrs.Thorman
request that the vessels be withdrawn from the Society's
Classification, and in the circumstances the Classing Committee,
who had the cases before them on Friday, 12th instant, decided to
give instructions for the character of each barge to be expunged
from the Register Book with a red line (8.27.), indicating non-
compliance with the Society's Rules, and Messrs.Thorman were
informed accordingly.

In reply, Messrs.Thorman state as follows, viz.:—

"As these vessels have only just recently
"been taken over by us for account of Messrs.The Coal Trading
"Association, Rotterdam, we must not be held responsible for
"non-compliance with your Society's Rules. It is intended that
"these barges shall be employed for the stowage of coal in the
"Mediterranean, so that the retention of their names in your
"Society's Register Book is no longer necessary."
