Dear Sirs,


I was duly favoured with your letter of the 1st instant, and note what you say regarding the case of the s.s. "HOUTHANDEL", and in reply I think it well to explain that no charge is being made by this Society in respect of the time and trouble which were involved in dealing with this case, but the account rendered to you only contains the out-of-pocket expenses for the cablegram which was necessitated by your omitting to complete the special survey at Antwerp, and in order to meet your convenience by continuing the classification of the vessel until she arrived in Japan.

The Committee are, therefore surprised to receive your suggestion that the small amount of £7 should be divided between you and the Society, but they hope that with this explanation you will agree that it is only reasonable that you should pay the account.
