Dear Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 12th instant regarding the case of the steam trawler "CLIXBY", I beg to acquaint you that Mr. Leicester has interviewed the Owners today and found that the vessel is now at Fleetwood but no slipping facilities are available.

All slipways in Fleetwood are at present occupied with damage cases and the Owners of the "CLIXBY" regret that in existing circumstances it will be impossible to complete the Special Survey No.1 at this time .

It is proposed to hold the Boiler Survey and as much as possible of the Special Survey this week, a start being made on Wednesday, the completion of survey being held over until next settling in from 2 to 3 months' time. In view of previous correspondence, I shall be obliged if you will kindly wire to this office tomorrow if this proposal is considered satisfactory, as Mr. Leicester will be leaving for Fleetwood early on Wednesday morning.
