OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR *Condition*

At request of the Captain Superintendent of *H. M. Dockyard Pembroke Dock*, I  
did the dockyard, and found this vessel in the dry dock.  
Bottom, keel, and Rudder was cleaned, examined, and recoated.  
Plating on the port and starboard side of the bow was found to be  
sinking and also along the lower edge of the Sheerstrake Plating amidships on  
and starboard side, and a request was made for these places to be sealed and  
fixed, and this was carried out. Examination made of the decks, rigging, and  
masts, and new rattans were fitted when required.
