REPORT ON MASTS, SPARS, AND RIGGING.

Dear Sir,

Having, in accordance with your instructions, examined the Masts, Spars, and Rigging, and Iron Work of same, of the Wood Auxiliary Schooner "BAYMAUD", ex "MAUD", of London,

I have to report that I found, from survey made aloft and on deck, the Fore, Main and Mizzen Masts in good condition, also the Booms, Gaffs and Yard;

The iron work throughout has been examined and found, or made, good.

The Rigging has been examined throughout, and found to be well preserved and in good condition.

The Lanyards and seasoning have been renewed as required.

The Sails have been examined and repaired and are now complete and in good order.

The whole of the Masts, Spars, Rigging, and Sails are now, in my opinion, in a satisfactory condition, and in every way fit to withstand severe service.
