
Dear Sir,

Yacht "FLYING CLOUD", we find on examining the vessel that the stem is decayed, Forecastle Margin planks, also several of the timbers in way of same are decayed and on opening up the ceiling 6'0" below top, find that the timbers are decayed at that position, outside planking on Forecastle side decayed and on cleaning away a decayed plank amidships on Port side find that the timbers are decayed there also, and we submit that the vessel should have a Special Survey at this time and shall be pleased to receive instructions regarding same.
