Dear Sirs,

With reference to Mr. Lowson's letters of the 29th ultimo and 2nd instant respecting the jigger mast proposed to be fitted in the Auxiliary Yacht "FLYING CLOUD" and intended to be utilised as an exhaust from the machinery, I have to inform you that the sizes of masts for yachts are not embodied in the Yacht Rules, but the Committee require that masts, where fitted, are to be in good condition.

The arrangement as shewn on the plans forwarded by you appears to be satisfactory, but you should see that the support at the heel of the mast is fitted to your satisfaction, and the arrangement for getting rid of the exhaust is satisfactory.

It is considered that man or hand holes should be arranged in the water jacket plating one above and the other below the upper deck to enable the mast to be examined periodically.

The plans in question are returned herewith.

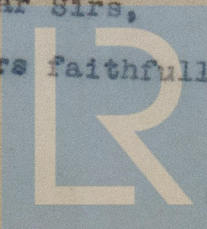
