Dear Sir,

We think it well to amplify the statement in our letter of yesterday's date as regards item 5 and explain that:-

The 2nd deck is watertight from bulkhead at frame 32 to tween deck watertight bulkhead at 63 frame without any opening whatever in the 2nd deck. Forward of this the 2nd deck is fitted watertight by means of steel angle collars round the frames at the sides of the vessel but in this zone there is a stairway opening in the 2nd deck leading down to the hold near to the middle line at frames 70 & 73, so that^{as} a watertight deck completely unpierced with steel watertight collars at the ship's side, the portion of the 2nd deck referred to in item 5 of our letter of yesterday's date extends between watertight bulkheads at 35 and 63 frames.

Would you please therefore, take this letter as part of our letter to you of yesterday's date.
