Dear Mr. Scott:

I have to confirm cablegrams exchanged relative to the classification certificates of the motor vessel "Elizabeth Ruth" and, in this connection think it well to advise you that owners have been successful in having the case reopened.

One of the contentions of the lawyers is that the vessel was not classed as original classification certificates had not been received and they were anxious to have a statement from you giving, in detail, the reasons for the withholding of such certificates.

I had previously advised them that I was not aware of any reason why the certificates had not come forward but they insisted that I cable you in the premises.

I cannot trace having received from you the original first entry report on the vessel; the only original report in my possession being MOBILE No. 44, covering the alterations carried out after the specifications have been drawn up for the necessary stiffening.

If you have not now done so, I think it would be as well if the certificates were now forwarded, unless you have some good reasons to the contrary.
