Dear Sirs,

I beg to acquaint you that the Committee have had under their consideration today a letter received from the H. Society's Surveyors at Aberdeen, in which they state they have been informed that you have not yet come to any decision in regard to the submission of the steam trawler "VICTOR" to the 2nd Special Survey N°2 for which she became due in January, 1928.

In the circumstances I am directed by the Committee to point out that the year of grace allowed by the Society's Rules for the completion of this survey expired at the end of January last, and to say that if the vessel is in commission arrangements must be made for this inspection to take place at once in order to entitle her to retain her class in the Register Book. Should, however, the vessel be laid up the Committee will be agreeable to her retaining her class in the Register Book for a period of twelve months subject to the conditions usually required by them in similar cases, viz:- that the overdue survey and all necessary repairs be completed before the vessel again proceeds to sea, and that you undertake to have this done if she remain your property, and should she be offered for sale to inform intending purchasers that the class is allowed to remain subject to this being done.


