Dear Sir,

S. With reference to the Liverpool Report No. 114785 on the steamer "PENNLAND", I think it well to inform you that the vessel was examined in dry dock by the Society's Surveyors at Belfast in January last, but that nothing was then done in regard to a further General Examination, although the present condition of various items was reported to be good.

As you are aware, the notation of "Examined LR 8-40" in respect of the Survey held at your port was valid for six months but in view of the Committee's later decision that future examinations of this nature should be carried out at twelve monthly intervals, as set forth in Circular No. 1773, it will be appreciated if the Surveyors can state whether in their opinion the vessel can be considered efficient until August, 1941, which would mean that the next General Examination will be postponed until that date.
