With reference to my letter of the 25th September last relative to the steamer "PENNLAND", formerly classed with the Germanischer Lloyd, I beg to acquaint you that the Committee have now had before them a report received from the Society's Surveyors at Belfast, from which it appears that the vessel has been placed in drydock and the bottom coated. On account of damage through collision, shell plates N.9, O.8 and P.9 on the starboard side were found slightly indented and a port light broken. Temporary repairs have been effected and it is recommended permanent repairs be carried out at a convenient opportunity.
