Dear Sirs,

With reference to your letter of the 10th October, 1928 addressed to the Society's Surveyor at Middlesbrough furnishing the undertaking required by the Committee at that time for the maintenance of the class of your barque "FOREST PRIDE" in the Society's Register Book, I beg to acquaint you that as this vessel would appear to be still laid up with no immediate prospect of being again placed in commission the Committee do not see how they can agree to her class being retained indefinitely. They will, however, be willing to allow the vessel's class to remain undisturbed for a further period of twelve months provided a General Examination be now made by the Society's Surveyors and she be found to be in good condition. Such a General Examination will thereafter be required annually for the maintenance of the vessel's class in the Register Book whilst she is laid up until the expiration of her class in September, 1931. I shall therefore be glad to learn your intentions in regard to the vessel's classification and what arrangements you propose making
