Dear Mr. Sonne,

I am duly favoured with your letter of the 22nd instant relative to the steamers belonging to Messrs. Marius Nielsen & Son and note that you have now had the opportunity of an interview with Mr. Marius Nielsen and his Superintendent on the subject of the retention of the classification of their vessels with this Society. I have carefully noted your remarks and am pleased to learn that you can confirm that no complaints have ever been made by the Owners, or their Superintendent, regarding the way in which the Society's Surveyors have carried out their duties in connexion with the surveys of the vessels owned by this Company. I also note that the Owners' decision at present applies only to the steamers "SIGRID", "KAREN", "MARGRETHE" and "THYRA", but in view of the intimation made in the letter they addressed to the Society's Office at Copenhagen on the 10th instant, a translation of which accompanied your letter of the 11th, no action will be taken until a further communication is received as to when they desire the classes of these vessels to be withdrawn.
