therein they have given instructions for the class of each
vessel to be withdrawn from the Society's Register Book and
three dots (...) inserted in lieu thereof, indicating withdrawal
of class at Owners' request.

Whilst the Committee much regret to learn of your
reason for the withdrawal of the classification of your vessels
from this Society, they are very pleased to note that the
decision is due to no other cause than the necessity of
reducing expenses, as explained in your letter.


