Dear Sir,

I regret that your letter M of 15th inst. regarding the steamer "Ruth" has not been replied to earlier. The letter arrived whilst I was on leave and by some omission on the part of the office lad was not registered and only came to my notice yesterday when looking through back correspondence.

In regard to the question of brackets for supporting the deck in way of hatchway it would seem that such might be dispensed with as the deep web frames are situated at the points indicated on the plan for the brackets and they extend right out to the hatch as now indicated on the plan. It should be added that, the vessel being now in this port, I have taken the opportunity to confirm this by a further inspection.
