The 1st S.S. No. 3, due 5.39 has been partly held by the examination of the bottom, rudder, peak tanks, D.B. under engines, cofferdams, anchors, cables, chain locker, masts, rigging and verification of freeboard.

A Notation of 'Examined 5.41' valid for 12 months has been assigned.

The class is subject to the topmasts being specially examined by 5.42, and to indented shell plating in E.F.G & F strakes (s.s.) and buckled pump room bulkhead wing plate etc being dealt with at the Owners' convenience.

The SUVA Lloyd's Agent Surveyor reports this tanker afloat and repairs effected to F.P. tank.

It is submitted the vessel is worthy to remain as classed subject as above.
