

Dear Sir,

S. I am favoured with your letter of the 9th instant respecting your motor vessel "PRIMULA", from which I note that you do not see your way to sign the form of undertaking enclosed with my letter of the 6th instant regarding the overdue Special Survey No.2 on this vessel.

I think, however, you may not quite appreciate the position, and I would explain that in all cases of laid up vessels which are classed with this Society, and in which the year of grace allowed by the Rules for the completion of an overdue Special Survey has expired, as in this instance, the Committee require as a condition of the class being retained an undertaking to be furnished that the overdue Special Survey and all outstanding repairs will be carried out before the vessel again goes into commission, or that intending purchasers shall be advised of the actual position.

You will therefore see that the signing of the form, to which you demur, does not bind intending purchasers to keep the vessel in the Society's classification, but only

informs them of the condition under which the class has been allowed to remain undisturbed.

In these circumstances, therefore, if it is desired that the vessel's class should remain undisturbed in the Register Book whilst she is laid up, I shall be glad if you will return the form previously sent, duly signed.

At the same time, I think it well to enclose a translation of the form in Italian, which may be signed, if so preferred.
