"TAYCO" CHAIN CABLE AND WAR EMERGENCY
REDUCTION OF EQUIPMENT.

With reference to Circular No. 1769 relating to the permissible reduction of equipment in the present emergency, I have to acquaint you the Ministry of Shipping now state that in the case of "Tayco" Chain Cable it has been decided that :—

For new ships the reduction in length of cable as a war emergency measure shall not apply (as already intimated in the preliminary letter sent from the Society's Glasgow Office on the 21st ultimo to certain ports).

For existing vessels, if the Owners desire the normal peace-time length of cable no objection will be raised by the Ministry.
