This vessel was built in America in 1920 and was classed with the American Bureau of Shipping.

A survey has ^{now} been held by the N.Ns. Surveyors with a view to classification with this Society. The machinery is similar to that in the S.S. "SAN VINCENTE" recently surveyed for classification.

Various repairs have been carried out. All plain tubes in the boilers have been renewed. Main crankshaft journals, condenser tubes, and circulating pump have been renewed, and an additional General Service Pump fitted.

It is submitted that this vessel is eligible for THE RECORD.
