Dear Sir,

I duly received your letter of the 12th instant, enclosing a circular letter and form of proxy received from Mr. Joseph W. Shephard, Incorporated Accountant, Manchester, in connexion with the affairs of Messrs. Isaac J. Abdela & Mitchell Ltd.

The amounts outstanding against this firm are believed to be as follows, viz:-

A Bill of £50 due on the 13th May 1924 in respect of fees and expenses for the survey of the "AURORA", "CONISTON" and "SHELL MEX 4" has not been met.

In addition, the fees and expenses in respect of the Special Survey during construction of the steamer "CORNISH MERCHANT" have not been paid. These amount to £88.7.8, making a total due of £138.7.8.

It is thought that it would be well for you to attend the meeting of creditors on the 26th instant at the Midland Hotel, Manchester, at 12 o'clock noon, with a view to ascertaining what steps are proposed to be taken.
