and that I ^{will} have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be continued as at present classed in the Society's Register Book, with fresh record of survey S.42, subject to indented bulwark plating etc. (s.s.f) and slightly twisted rudder head being dealt with at Owners convenience, also to indented plate No.3 in main deck sheer (s.s.) being dealt with

being fit to carry efficient for her present special service.
