ST. AGNES.—Lisbon, Sept. 17.—The 64 survivors of the British steamer St. Agnes, the whole ship's complement, arrived here to-day in the American liner Exochorda. The Exochorda rescued Captain Powell, the British officers and the Indian crew after the St. Agnes had been sunk by a submarine 700 miles west of Lisbon. She was torpedoed without warning, survivors said, last Thursday (Sept. 12) when she was 100 miles from Madeira, on her way to England from Africa with a cargo of ore. After the crew had taken to the lifeboat the submarine fired on them a dozen times but without scoring a hit. The next day they were all rescued by the Exochorda. All are stated to be in good health and are now waiting in Lisbon until they can return to England.—Reuter.

ST. AGNES.—New York, Sept. 14.—The American steamer Exochorda has wirelessed that the British steamer St. Agnes has sent out a distress signal from a position given as 700 miles west of Lisbon. The Exochorda, which is hurrying to the rescue, has not reported the cause of the distress of the St. Agnes, but officials in New York assume that she has been torpedoed.—Reuter.

London, Sept. 15.—Steamer Exochorda reports that she has rescued all the crew of 64 of the steamer St. Agnes, which sank 700 miles west of Lisbon.—Reuter.
