Limited, and the Master, survey the/s "SAINT AGNES", of London, 5,183 tons gross, whilst afloat at Table Bay, on the 8th August 1940, for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of the damage, stated to have been sustained when this vessel was undocking in tow of the Tug "Ludwig Wiener", on the 8th August 1940.

On examination the undersigned found the following damage:-

- (1) Fairlead on the Starbd. aft. deck torn from its fastenings and then base plate buckled.
- (2) Fairlead on the Starbd. Poop deck torn from its fastenings and carried away.
- (3) One section of handrails bent.

The above damage to be repaired at Owners' convenience.
