July and subsequently on account of damage stated to have been caused when vessel in dealing with enemy submarine dropped a depth charge on June 15th. 1942 when bound from New Zealand to U.K. via Panama.

and that I have ^{will} transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be continued as now classed without fresh record of survey subject to vessel being specially

examined at next dry docking (underwater explosion).
The class is also subject to permanent repairs to Nos.5 & 6 plates from aft 2nd. strake below sheer (S.S) etc, and to pierced and scored port quarter plating at Owners' convenience. Permanent repairs to APT, also to plating in way of No.2 main 'tween deck, frames, etc. (cargo shifting) first opportunity.
