With reference to your damage report C187, dated 10th March last, I shall be glad to learn whether any further developments have arisen in connection with this case.

This vessel, as she lay, was abandoned to the underwriters, and was afterwards purchased by the War Shipping Administration of the U.S.A. for \$80,000 in U.S. funds. They have now removed all the machinery from the vessel with the exception of the screw shaft, propeller and stern bush, the last shipment being made a few days ago. We are advised that the steering engine, rudder, stock and quadrant were to be fitted on the Tanker "G.S. WALDEN", now at New York under repairs and the main and auxiliary engines and boilers were shipped to Baltimore to be fitted in the Tanker "JAVA ARROW". The hull is to be scrapped.
