Dear Sirs,

With reference to the case of the steamer "ROBERT", I beg to acquaint you the Committee have had before them at their meeting today the report of inspection recently made of this vessel by the Society's Surveyors in London, as a result of which it is considered she is in a satisfactory condition to trade for a period of six months.

A notation of "Examined L.R. 5.40" will accordingly be made against the vessel's name in the Society's Register Book as being indicative of the nature of the survey now held.

I think it well to add for your information that no general examination has been made of the machinery on the present occasion, but it is recommended that the Society's Surveyors be afforded an opportunity to examine the boilers when they are next opened up for cleaning or repairs.
