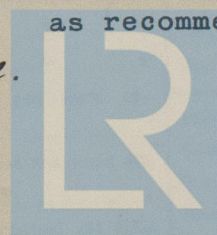
It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to remain as classed with record of survey 9, 41 as recommended, subject as above except as regards the sternframe solepiece.
