Dear Sirs,

M. I am in receipt of Mr. Costantini's letter of the 18th instant in reply to mine of the 14th from which it is noted that Messrs. Cantieri Riuniti dell'Adriatico's No. 1214 is to be built as a duplicate of their No. 1202.

With regard thereto I have to state that provided the vessel be constructed in accordance with the plans approved for the sister ship referred to, the Rules in all other respects be complied with, and the materials and workmanship be to the Society's satisfaction, she will be eligible to be classed 100A1 "Carrying Petroleum in Bulk" with the notation "Longitudinal framing at bottom and at deck".

The steel to be used in the construction of this vessel must be made by the Open Hearth process at works recognised by the Committee, and must be tested by the Society's Surveyors in accordance with the requirements of the Rules.

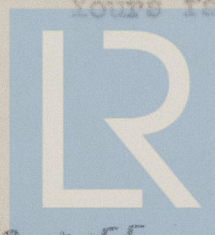
I shall be glad if you will endorse the plans of No. 1202 with the new yard number.
