This is to Certify that

O. HANBETH  
the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Brazilian Consul at Philadelphia, attend the Tanker "J.E. O'NEIL", official No. 215903, while lying on drydock at the Sun Shipbuilding & Dry Dock Company, Chester, Pa., November 1, 1940, and have to report as follows:-

- 1) The vessel's bottom, stem, stern frame, rudder bushings, propeller and outside shell plating were examined and found in good order. The bottom was recoated.
- 2) The Stern Bushing wear down was 5/32".
- 3) The sea valves were opened out, overhauled, examined and found satisfactory.
- 4) Small leaks in forepeak tank, port and starboard sides were caulked and made tight.
- 5) The docking plug in No. 1 Tank was tightened. Two small cracks in rudder arms were vee'd-out and welded.

This vessel is now, in my opinion, in good and efficient condition, eligible to remain as classed in Lloyd's Register of Shipping (+100A1), and fit to carry petroleum in bulk.
