THE WAR

TREVILLEY.—Lisbon, Oct. 6.—Fifteen survivors of the torpedoed British motor vessel Treville and 13 from the Dutch steamer BREEDLIK arrived here to-day on board the Portuguese steamer Cubango. The survivors from the British vessel were picked up on Sept. 20 from a raft, on which the seamen had spent 10 days and nights. Next day the Cubango sighted a raft with the survivors of the Dutch freighter which had been torpedoed. Both vessels had been sunk by a German submarine 500 miles off Cape Palmas, Liberia. The sub-commander made prisoner the and first engineer of the British vessel, and carried off members of the ship's crew, including the officers, and sailing.
